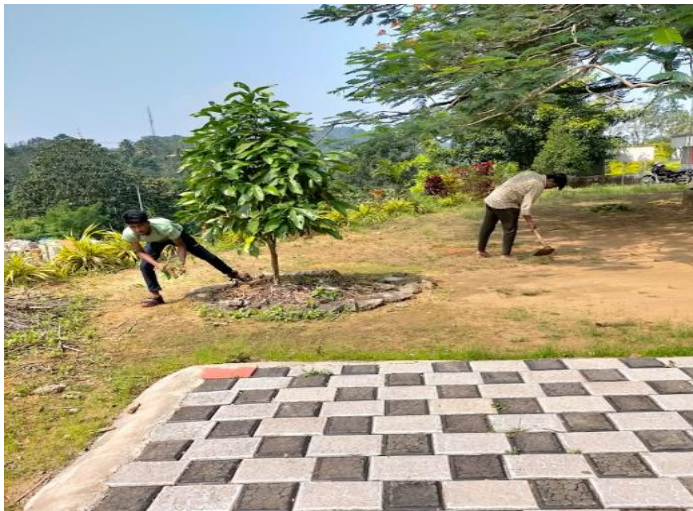


### **3.4.3. Extension/Outreach Programmes (2019-2020)**

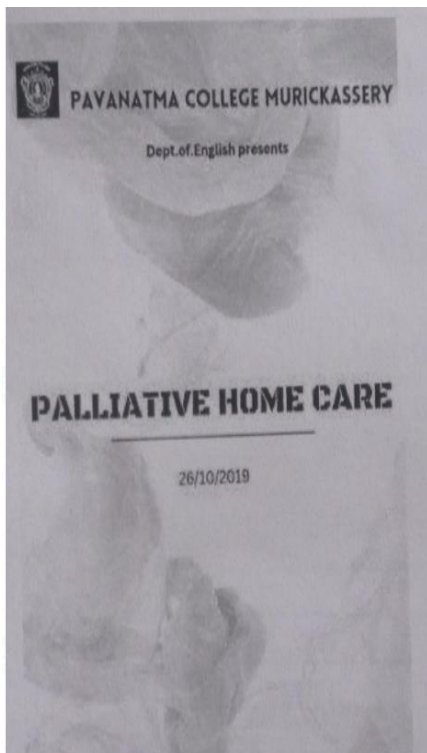
